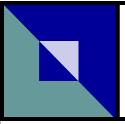

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Annual Report and Thank You! From Bishop Laurie Skow-Anderson January 2023

Dear Pastors, Deacons, SAMs, lay leaders, members and friends of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin,

Happy New Year! Did you make a New Year's resolution? I wonder what would happen if entire congregations or even if the whole church council would make a New Year's resolution together. What would it be? What might be a God pleasing, faithful New Year's resolution for you, personally? Your church? Your church council?

What is your congregation's New Year's Resolution?

Maybe the New Year's resolution might be to begin every church meeting in the next year by asking a God question like, "I wonder, what does God want us to accomplish in this meeting today? How might what we do in our meeting today please God and be faithful

to our baptismal promises?" As someone once famously said, "The main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing. The main thing is Jesus." What if our New Year resolution is to repeat that phrase before every meeting?

As a synod, we are good at New Year's resolutions, or at least we always have resolutions at our synod assembly! This year our synod resolution will be to learn more about our indigenous neighbors. Jesus said that the main thing, the greatest commandment was to love God and love our neighbors. On Monday, January 23 we will be learning from our Ho-Chunk neighbors from Black River Falls at our Winter Theological Gathering Rebound: Unsettled History-Hopeful Future at Luther Park in Chetek. At the synod assembly on April 29 our theme is Rebound: From Worry to Wonder, there will be resolution that will come before the assembly encouraging every congregation to learn about their indigenous neighbors and write their own land acknowledgement and include it on their website and welcome statements in their bulletins. What if your congregation's New Year's Resolution was to learn more about your neighbors and discover new ways to love them?

Our synod's New Year's resolution is to love our neighbors by learning more about our indigenous neighbors and encouraging congregations to write and use land acknowledgements.

What is a land acknowledgement?

It is formal statement that a public event is taking place on land

originally inhabited by indigenous peoples. (Wikipedia) This statement recognizes and respects Indigenous peoples as the traditional stewards of the land and the relationship that exists between them and their traditional territories. This year the Endowment Fund gave \$1,000.00 for our annual budget. Marlene Onstad coordinated Easter cards and mementos for our congregation's shut in members. An Easter brunch was served by church volunteers. Thanksgiving dinner was served this year to approximately 180 members of the community by Michelle an incredible team of volunteers. The Social Concerns Ministry collected \$495 in donations for the ELCA Good Gifts program and sent an additional \$495 in matching funds to the ELCA (matching funds were sent in January 2024). A contribution was also made to Christmas from the Heart. Rita coordinated Christmas cards and gifts for our congregation's shut in members. Endowment Fund applications were sent in December to several non-profit area charitable organizations to encourage them to take the opportunity to apply for funding.

Vacation Bible School was held July 31 through August 4. This year's theme was Twists & Turns. Each day the kids played their way through the program while learning that Jesus is always with us through life's twists and turns. The daily opening and closing skits were performed by Lee Glenz and Jorge Mora Bates; music with Jeanette Tobiason, Bible study with Pastor Ahles, Crafts with Denise Clark, Judy Clark, Michelle Jacobson, and Kate Back; meals prepared by Martha Solfest and Lisa Juodis with a pizza party on the last day with Little Caesar's pizza (Thank you Kate for picking up the order!). Due to the number of youth available, the Christmas program "Wise Guys" was put on hold until 2024. The children sang, rang bells, and kazooed their way through some fun songs during the Christmas Concert on December 20, 2023.

We continue on with the New Testament January through May learning about the incredible love Jesus has for us and what it's like to have the power of Jesus in our lives.

Rather than holding Vacation Bible School for one week during the summer, which always seems to coincide with swimming lessons, we are planning to divide it up over the summer months on Wednesday nights to ease the pressure on volunteers, staff, parents, and children.

Give us the ability to adapt to the cultural, economic and social changes that occur in the neighborhoods we serve.

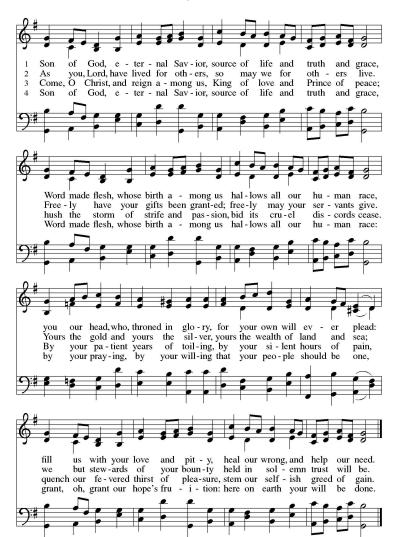
Receive our prayer, O God.
