

Immanuel Lutheran Council Meeting April 9, 2024

Present: Pastor Lorenz, Kris Husby, John Eide, Bob Schlink, Gloria Wagener, Dean Anderson, Tyler Back, Michelle Jacobson

Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm.

Rev Lorenz led a time of reflection and opening prayer.

March meeting minutes were reviewed and approved via email prior to the meeting. Motion by Bob Schlink to accept the March minutes, second by Gloria Wagener. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report was reviewed. Motion by Tyler Back to accept the March Treasurer's Report, second by John Eide. Motion carried.

A discussion was held concerning the funds in the Designated Building Fund for the roof regarding moving the funds to a CD to earn more interest until they are needed for the new roof. Motion by Bob Schlink to move \$80,000 from the Building Fund to an 11-month CD at CCU, or at CCFBank if it is able to match or beat CCU's interest rate, second by Dean Anderson. Motion carried.

CBELC Update

CBELC update given. CBELC has been informed of the rent increase beginning July 1, 2024. Pastor Terry is working with Katie to start doing some things with the kids in the fall. A Sunday School room that was being used for storage by CBELC has been reclaimed.

Pastor's Report

- Installation Service
 - The Installation service order is done, both presidents and three other folks from the call committee will be taking part.
 - Rev Diane House, assistant to the bishop for the NW Synod will be taking part as the presiding minister.
- Confirmation
 - Five students have begun classes to complete their second year and be ready to affirm their baptism at the worship service on Sunday, May 19th (we had to change the date in order that all five families could attend).
 - Confirmands have been scheduled to help lead worship services by serving as acolytes, crucifers, and lectors.
- Worship Bulletins
 - Done through mid-September; this gives a little breathing room to focus on other things.
- Summer Bulletin
 - I'm proposing the use of the same bulletin from Memorial Day to Labor Day. It is a framework of the service and allows for more spontaneous or extemporaneous parts done by those who lead.
 - Psalms are used as the call to worship.
 - Hymns are announced on the day of.
 - Lessons are not printed in the bulletin (copies could be made available if any were interested in having them.
- Guitar Led Worship
 - I have spoken with Gabe Koxlien and he has offered to help lead a more casual/contemporary worship service with guitar accompaniment either occasionally or in a regular monthly rotation.

Old Business

Building Maintenance

Spring cleaning and organizing: The double Sunday School room is cleaned out except for desks and chairs. West side room is cleared except for desk and tables. Items that may be donated are going to the High School. Two high school students in a leadership class need volunteer hours and will be assisting with various cleaning and organizing projects. The Library still needs to be organized in the Fireside Room. Four Sunday School classrooms will be available in the Fall as well as the Fireside room.

Elevator: A service call was placed to All-Star Elevator. Currently waiting on a call back to set up time for repairs. The service call fee is \$200. They will provide an estimate if any major repairs are necessary.

Sunday School was discussed. The last day of Sunday School will be May 12. No update on Vacation Bible School.

Confirmation update was discussed in the Pastor's report.

New Business

The council would like to bring back and/or establish committees such as the Altar Guild/Flowers, Holiday/Special Events, Board of Education, etc. A contact (go-to) person would need to be established first.

Job descriptions for the Parish Administrator and Janitor were provided to the council for review. The janitor's job description was revised in 2021. The Parish Administrator's job description is over four pages long, has not been revised in over 10 years, and reads more like a task list. The council will work on summarizing responsibilities of the Parish Administrator and removing items that are no longer required.

Ushers: Jim Husby has volunteered to be head usher and has contact several people to put together an usher list. If anyone is interested in ushering, contact Jim.

Offering: The counting process was provided to the council for review. The process for coffee hour donations will be posted in the kitchen. Kris Husby, Gloria Wagener, Bob Schlink, and Dean Anderson will be trained on the counting procedure. The Executive Committee is to have access to the drop safe.

Immanuel is providing full scholarships to Luther Park Bible Camp for kids to attend this summer. Coffee Hour proceeds during April and May will go to the Youth Ministry Fund.

Sunday, May 5, 2024 will be a "Sweatshirt Sunday" with spring cleanup after worship and a cookout style lunch at 11 am. Tasks to be completed include outdoor cleaning and well as indoor. Kids can go play during cleanup; need volunteers to provide adult supervision.

The Joint Parish Meeting was held on Tuesday, March 19, 2024 at Elk Creek. The split remains unchanged at 60/40. The opportunity to hold more joint worship services was discussed.

The next council meeting is on Tuesday, May 14, 2024 at 6 pm.

Other

Discussion was held regarding planting a tree to replace the old ash tree that was cut down.

Office hours are to return to what they were in December. Future changes in office hours must be approved by the council.

Meeting was adjourned following the Lord's Prayer.
